During his presidency, Mr. Kremlev has dedicated all his efforts towards restoring IBA's financial integrity and implementing sporting and governance reforms within the organization. Moreover, he is focused on improving the level of IBA sports events, turning boxing into a powerful instrument for upward social mobility through the establishment of prize money fund for boxers and providing constant support for National Federations, athletes and coaches.

On Kremlev's initiative central celebration of the International Boxing Day took place in Belgrade, Serbia (2021) & Kinshasa, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (2022).

- Initiation of new formats of boxing competitions, such as IBA World Boxing Tour and IBA Champions Night (a semi-professional event)
- Various educational and charity initiatives, such as openings of international boxing academies and sports centers, introduction of Fair Chance Team, donation of boxing equipment etc.
